Lutheran Augustana Center for Extended Care and Rehabilitation is a New York State licensed not-for-profit organization established in 1908 and has a proud history of providing high quality nursing and rehabilitative care. All staff work very hard at creating a team oriented environment to promote positive outcomes for residents.

Augustana opened its new state-of-the-art 240 bed skilled nursing facility in 1995 which was enhanced by expansion in 2002. We provide twenty-four hour a day skilled nursing care, medical, and other professional services for individuals requiring long term care and for those who will benefit from intensive restorative rehabilitation.



NURSING

Augustana's professional nursing staff is specially trained to meet the diverse and complex needs of each resident. Sub-acute, rehabilitation, long term and palliative care is provided by our compassionate and dedicated nursing staff composed of registered nurses, licensed practical nurses and certified nursing assistants. Registered nurses are certified in gerontological nursing, intravenous therapy, phlebotomy and CPR/basic and advanced cardiac life support. A nursing rehabilitation program is provided on each nursing unit to increase and/or sustain each resident's independence by supporting their abilities in ambulation, range of motion and feeding and dressing skills.

MEDICAL STAFF

An attending physician coordinates management of each resident's prescribed medical care. Each nursing unit has designated physician coverage which allows for physician accessibility to both residents and their families.

SOCIAL WORK

A social worker is assigned to each resident to provide support and guidance to the resident and

their family members. The social worker serves as a liaison to other departments and helps address resident and family concerns.

FOOD & NUTRITION SERVICES

Augustana serves three full-course meals daily in its nursing unit dining rooms. Staff dietitians evaluate each resident's nutritional needs and individual preferences.

PASTORAL CARE

Pastoral care, through clergy and volunteer ministry, provides spiritual care that reflects the rich diversity of our residents' faith and traditions. Encouragement and support are offered through visitation and weekly Mass, Sunday Service of Holy Communion, morning devotions and holiday services in Augustana's chapel.

THERAPEUTIC RECREATION

Therapeutic recreation programs are scheduled seven days a week and include adapted sports and exercise, cognitive games, reminiscence, sing-a-longs, pet visits, entertainment and trips.

REHABILITATION SERVICES



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The Rehabilitation Service serves all facility residents and is recognized for its intensive short-term restorative rehabilitation for the treatment of complex orthopedic, neurological and other medical conditions. Each resident brings distinct needs which are managed by caring physical, occupational and speech therapists. Necessary equipment and personal assistive devices are secured for residents to aid in their independence and functioning upon discharge home.
